Good Afternoon,

It has been an incredibly busy week at school this week and there has been an array of learning opportunities taking place. On top of learning lots of new things, the children in Years 1-6 have been completing baseline assessments in reading, grammar, punctuation and spelling, and Maths. These results will be used to inform planning and support for the children to ensure that every child is getting the level of support and challenge that they need in each of the core subjects.

Specialist subjects have started in earnest and it has been fantastic to see all of our rooms in use and such amazing opportunities being offered to all of the children. I sat in with Year 1 and 2 learning all about Castles and Knights in History, and Year 3 learning all about Rainforests in Geography. The children in Reception greeted me with 'Bonjour Madam Pay!' when I popped in, and were learning some gymnastic skills like balancing and rolling in PE.

Years 5 and 6 spent some time on Roald Dahl day choosing and talking about their favourite Roald Dahl book and it was great to see the Years 3 and 4 starting to get to grips with using Google Classroom. Miss Richardson kindly took the very first Forest and Eco school lessons for me as I was off-site training and the children explored the grounds and discussed a list of rules for outdoor learning which we will display. 


























#### Mr Hoots Attendance
